INSTRUCTION

- > Increased enrollment in distance education classes by 23%
- > Increased and improved curriculum offerings with 4 new programs; 4 revised programs; 17 new courses, and 15 revised courses

More than 200 administrators, faculty and staff from 60 community colleges, associations and the state Chancellor's office attended The New World of Noncredit, co-hosted by IEPI (Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative) to hear best practices on how to build and expand noncredit instruction in the state.
